Baptism:

The Sacrament of Baptism is usually celebrated on the First and Third Sundays of each month at Noon. Please call the Rectory and speak to the parish priest to register. First-time parents and godparents are expected to attend a pre-baptismal formation session, which is offered on the second Sunday of the month in the Church after the 10:30 a.m. Mass as needed,. To register for session, please call parish secretary before first Friday of each month.

<u>Marriage</u>:

Couples planning to be married should contact the Rectory at least 6 months in advance of the intended wedding date. Attendance at a Marriage Preparation program is required in accord with Archdiocesan Policy.

Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion:

The parish priests are happy to assist anyone who wishes to receive the anointing of the sick, or to receive Holy Communion. Special Ministers of Holy Communion also assist in taking Holy Communion to those parishioners who are unable to get to Mass. For more information, kindly call the Rectory.

Catholic School Policy

School-aged children of OLC attend may attend either **Holy Family Regional Catholic School** in Aston or **Notre Dame de Lourdes Catholic School** in Swarthmore. Our Parish does subsidize Catholic education for all parishioners of OLC who are active and contributing members of the Parish. **Please note:** Since our Parish School closed abruptly in June 2011, our school families began attending several Catholic elementary schools in the area. In fairness to those children currently attending the other schools, however, we will consider them "grandfathered" and continue to subsidize their education in accordance with the policy about attendance and parish support.

Children who attend Public School are requested to register in our **PREP** Program beginning in first grade to seventh grade. PREP meets on Tuesday evenings from September to May from 6:30

Reflections by Fr. Leonard Peterson Pentecost Sunday May 24, 2015

For car aficionados "of a certain age" like me, a former custom of the auto companies is fondly remembered and missed. In those bygone days, the various companies would debut their new models for the year each September. In the weeks prior, "teaser" ads would appear in magazines, newspapers and showroom windows featuring the gleaming parts of the cars to come, while the bulk of the car would be draped until a pre-chosen date. Only then could we "Ooh" and "Ahh" the whole car, usually the top-of-the-line edition, as the company hoped for a rush to their dealerships for a buying frenzy. Nowadays, new models come out at any time, and despite the usual fanfare, that once-a-year excitement is long gone.

I thought of those memories as I contemplated the once a year celebration of the awesome coming of the Holy Spirit that first Pentecost. An "unveiling" of sorts with sound and fury with tongues of fire. With all of that came those wonderful gifts of the Spirit given to that early community, and now to us, the present day community of the Church. Those gifts are readily available with no cost to us but gratitude. Each of us is gifted in some way. Just like those various car models of old, our gifts differ one from the other. Together they make the Church better than it would be without them

Just think of what talented painters and sculptors do to enhance our natural lives. The same holds true for musicians from Hayden to hip-hop. People in the helping professions who come to our aid when sickness or sadness enter our lives. Then there are entertainers who make us laugh and generous people who give us hope.

The Spirit's gifts go beyond all that and enrich our supernatural lives. Those tongues of fire prefigured the supercharged preaching of the Apostles, when foreigners of all kinds heard about Jesus that day in their native tongues and were set on fire to take up the faith.

This was all the result of the resurrection, when Jesus had come to that locked room and given the frightened disciples that incomparable gift of His peace. Note that He went right to the core matter of the forgiveness of sin, from which He had undergone torture and death to save us.

While the Church's official Lenten season of repentance has come and gone, there is always the year 'round need to repent because sin knows no season and takes no holiday. God's mercy enables us to become new models, not of cars but of Christian living, which never goes out of style.

Come Holy Spirit, and fill the hearts of Your faithful; enkindle in us the fire of Your love. Send forth Your Breath into our hearts, and we will be recreated in Your Image, and You will renew the face of the earth.
