Baptism:

The Sacrament of Baptism is usually celebrated on the First and Third Sundays of each month at Noon. Please call the Rectory and speak to the parish priest to register. First-time parents and godparents are expected to attend a pre-baptismal formation session, which is offered on the second Sunday of the month in the Church after the 10:30 a.m. Mass as needed,. To register for session, please call parish secretary before first Friday of each month.

Marriage:

Couples planning to be married should contact the Rectory at least 6 months in advance of the intended wedding date. Attendance at a Marriage Preparation program is required in accord with Archdiocesan Policy.

Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion:

The parish priests are happy to assist anyone who wishes to receive the anointing of the sick, or to receive Holy Communion. Special Ministers of Holy Communion also assist in taking Holy Communion to those parishioners who are unable to get to Mass. For more information, kindly call the Rectory.

Catholic School Policy

School-aged children of OLC may attend either **Notre Dame de Lourdes Catholic School** in Swarthmore or **Holy Family Regional Catholic School** in Aston . Our Parish does subsidize Catholic education for parishioners of OLC who are active and contributing members of the Parish, in accord with Parish Policy. Children who attend public school are requested to register in our **PREP** Program beginning in first grade to seventh grade. PREP meets on Tuesday evenings from September to May from 6:30 to 7:45p.m. There is a minimal tuition requested to defray costs of the materials. No one is denied access to PREP because of an inability to pay.

I hope very much to paint behind the cross and the side shrines this Fall and then to complete the painting of the sanctuary in the Spring.

TICKETS FOR PAPAL EVENTS ON THE PARKWAY

Last week we distributed over 140 tickets to the Papal Mass on the Parkway next Sunday, as well as 80 tickets for the Festival of the Families on the Parkway on Saturday Night.

A reminder: you don't necessarily need a ticket to attend either of these events, so if you still would like to go, all you need to do is get a transportation pass, which are still available via SEPTA.

Viewing the Papal Mass (via computer, or TV) does not fulfill the Sunday Mass Obligation; however, I would encourage our parish families to view the Papal events next week as a matter of spiritual devotion and piety. Check you local television listings to see which stations will be airing the Papal Mass live. You may also stream the Mass from an internet connection. Reflections

by Father Leonard N. Peterson Twenty Fifth Sunday In Ordinary Time

Teachers will easily recognize this typical classroom dialogue following a lesson:

Teacher: "Are there any questions?"

Students: Total silence.

Teacher: "Anything you don't understand?"

One student (hesitantly): "Will this be on the test?"

And so it goes. Not necessarily all the time like that, but enough times to make it an easy recall for me after 25 years in teaching. Whatever the dynamic that is at work here, it has to involve a certain fear of the teacher's reaction mixed in with fear of looking stupid to the class.

Note the similarity to that perennial happening with the reaction of Our Lord's chosen disciples gathered that long ago day in Peter's house just after Jesus predicted His passion for the second time. St. Mark tells us: "They did not understand the saying and they were afraid to question Him."

All of which brings up a question. Have you ever wanted to question God about something and were afraid to? Was it about a personal relationship difficulty? Family problem? Old thinking versus new? Health setback? Evil in the headlines? Trouble with the Church? Someone's addiction?

Whatever the situation, the important point is never to be afraid to talk it over with God as frankly as you would with your best friend. After all, God already knows your situation. He respects your intelligence and good will. All He asks in return is your respect for His intelligence. Add in His love for you; His ultimate mastery of a grand plan for the universe and everyone in it.

Here is precisely where our humility has to kick in. Or at least our recognition that humility is needed. Even though we cannot know the plan, it is certain that we are included. While God accepts our questions, He doesn't need our advice. Just our love and trust.

When Jesus brought that little child into the center of that circle of friends in Peter's house, He was asking us to consider a truth more important than our questions. Namely, our acknowledgement that receiving a humble little one, and a "little one" could be 25 or 65, we are really receiving Him. That should make us more receptive to His plan rather than our own.

Confidence in God, enough to ask Him questions, combined with the openness of mind and heart that lets us welcome an innocent, make for a quality disciple. In the "school" of Christian living, that merits an "A" on our report card, ready for Our Father's signature. That's the way it is when we reread the Gospel. We're always going back to school.
