Baptism:

<u>Marriage</u>:

Couples planning to be married should contact the Rectory at least 6 months in advance of the intended wedding date. Attendance at a Marriage Preparation program is required in accord with Archdiocesan Policy.

Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion:

The parish priests are happy to assist anyone who wishes to receive the anointing of the sick, or to receive Holy Communion. Special Ministers of Holy Communion also assist in taking Holy Communion to those parishioners who are unable to get to Mass. For more information, kindly call the Rectory.

Catholic School Policy

School-aged children of OLC may attend either **Notre Dame de Lourdes Catholic School** in Swarthmore or **Holy Family Regional Catholic School** in Aston . Our Parish does subsidize Catholic education for parishioners of OLC who are active and contributing members of the Parish, in accord with Parish Policy. Forty Hours Devotions: Begins next week

Financial Report Sunday

Today, we are distributing the Parish Financial Report for the Fiscal year 2014-15. Mike Blair returned in June to complete the end of the year work. I am grateful for his presence at all the Masses this weekend to review the report with you. As you will notice, we enjoy being debt free and with moderate financial holdings. However, the trends indicate during the past five years (and before), that our contributions from the members have been decreasing. I know that there are many reasons for this, but it is a reality we need to address.

During the summer, I have formed a committee of real estate brokers, financial, legal and business leaders to begin looking at various ways to market our school building. At present we are getting two appraisals for the school and part of the property. We will again meet in mid-October to review this material, and begin reviewing some proposals we have received.

Reflections by Father Leonard N. Peterson Twenty Seventh Sunday In Ordinary Time

Brand names have a certain evocative power. For example, if I were to say to you "Kellogg's" you'd be thinking "cereal" or one of that company's cereal products. The same holds for "Heinz" which makes you think "ketchup." Or "car insurance" at the mere mention of "Geico." (That last one claiming boldly that "everybody knows that.") By dint of longevity, or quality, or just aggressive advertising, certain brand names trigger such automatic responses.

I remember some years ago that one of our national supermarket chains proudly labelled their in-store products as "Ideal." It made no difference what the product was. That brand name was meant to entice you the consumer to believe that it was "perfect"; the epitome; the very model of a this, that, or the other thing.

So, using analogy, I could say that Jesus held up the ideal of marriage as designed by God when He took on his usual antagonists, the Pharisees, with their duplicitous question about the lawfulness of divorce. He explained patiently that Moses' permission for divorce was a concession on his part to human weakness. Again, the ideal in God's original plan was that married persons, man and woman, constitute "one flesh." Obviously divorce is forbidden because it contradicts God's plan. In our time, the Church still upholds that ideal, and always will. Yet she realizes that there are certain conditions and particular circumstances that guide her when a marriage falls short of the ideal. This is not the place for specificity.

We believers in Jesus acknowledge that He always holds up the ideal for us to follow. He does this to enlighten us, not to frighten us. To illustrate but not to frustrate. To motivate but not to enervate. Any physician of the mind would tell us that we need ideals to admire and goals to shoot for to give added purpose for our lives.

It is necessary and spiritually beneficial for divorced persons to remember that they are still valued members of the Church. There is a false idea floating around that divorced people are automatically excommunicated. That is not Church teaching.

It is good for each and every follower of Jesus to be well informed of the Church's position and practice on this subject when divorce is so prevalent and false understanding does such harm. The official Catechism gives us the teaching, and the Sunday Eucharist gives us the strength to live it in whatever circumstance we find ourselves in life.

Meanwhile, in a culture that has devalued marriage, we have before us a graced opportunity for good Catholic married couples to exemplify by their lives how to live out the Christian "brand name" conferred on them at Baptism. It is still true, as the hymn puts it, that "they will know us by our love." Come to think of it, that's a pretty good "brand name slogan", even if the New Testament said it first.
