### Confession:

Saturdays: 7:30 to 8 a.m.; 4:15 to 5 p.m.; and other times by appointment.

### Baptism:

The Sacrament of Baptism is usually celebrated on the First and Third Sundays of each month at Noon. Please call the Rectory and speak to the parish priest to register. First-time parents and godparents are expected to attend a pre-baptismal formation session, which is offered on the second Sunday of the month in the Church after the 10:30 a.m. Mass as needed. To register for session, please call parish secretary before first Friday of each month.

### Marriage:

Couples planning to be married should contact the Rectory at least 6 months in advance of the intended wedding date. Attendance at a Marriage Preparation program is required in accord with Archdiocesan Policy.

### Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion:

The parish priests are happy to assist anyone who wishes to receive the anointing of the sick, or to receive Holy Communion. Special Ministers of Holy Communion also assist in taking Holy Communion to those parishioners who are unable to get to Mass. For more information, kindly call the Rectory.

### Catholic School Policy

School-aged children of OLC may attend either **Notre Dame de Lourdes Catholic School** in Swarthmore or **Holy Family Regional Catholic School** in Aston. Our Parish does subsidize Catholic education for parishioners of OLC who are active and contributing members of the Parish, in accord with Parish Policy. Children who attend public school are requested to register in our **PREP** Program beginning in first grade to seventh grade. PREP meets on Tuesday evenings from September to May from 6:30 to 7:45p.m. There is a minimal tuition requested to defray costs of the materials. No one is denied access to PREP because of an inability to pay.

## Reflections by Fr. Leonard Peterson

Second Sunday Of Lent

February 21, 2016

White sandy beaches by a turquoise sea, all under a golden sun. Aah! Doesn't that make for an enticing picture in mid-February? No wonder the airlines run such images by our eyes knowing that many of us are "winter-weary" just now! How many of us who don't sled or ski but merely shovel the snow would like to oblige but know very well that such trips aren't for free.

However unintended, such enticements could persuade us to target Lent as the source of our sadness. Not a good thing for people who profess to be disciples of Christ. There's nothing inherently wrong with wanting to visit a warm beach at this time of year but rushing to that scene contradicts all the Lenten urging to go to the desert and contemplate our need for the discipline called penance.

Today's First Reading describes Abraham's call to leave familiar scenery and become the father of a new nation that will be great. If you doubt Abraham's courage and trust in God, consider your own attitude toward change.

Centuries later, St. Paul writes about his disappointment in the mediocre faith displayed by his Philippian converts in imitating people who make their stomachs their gods. Fair application to the many people among us who eat too much and always the wrong foods. Fasting is the classical Lenten penance urged upon us each year.

That blessed and fortunate trio of Peter, James and John get to see something far more attractive than a vacation spot: Jesus' transfiguration. What an uplift! What encouragement for them, and vicariously for us, as Jesus reveals a glimpse of His glory. Talk about something we all want to see in a place where we all hope to be!

But here's the rub. Despite St. Peter's wish to stay entranced by the vision, it vanishes as quickly as it appears, and the trio had to walk down the trail on Tabor with plain human Jesus. They had to re-enter the reality of an earthbound existence for a while longer. They had to learn that for the followers of Christ, glory only comes after the suffering. It is always the cross before the resurrection. Deep down we all know that.

Lent is like that physical exercise our doctors recommend and many of us detest, even though we know the doctor is right. We have to do it for our own good. Spiritually speaking, we know that the increased prayer and some bodily penance we choose for the season invigorates us like a good physical workout does. We strengthen those spiritual muscles we all need to believe in God here on earth and trust Him with His promises of a heavenly future. It will be something like arriving at a warm sandy beach in mid-winter, yes, but so much more. "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor has it entered into the heart of man the things which God has prepared for those who love Him." (I Cor. 2:9)
