To register for session, please call parish secretary before first Friday of each month.

Marriage:

Couples planning to be married should contact the Rectory at least 6 months in advance of the intended wedding date. Attendance at a Marriage Preparation program is required in accord with Archdiocesan Policy.

Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion:

The parish priests are happy to assist anyone who wishes to receive the anointing of the sick, or to receive Holy Communion. Special Ministers of Holy Communion also assist in taking Holy Communion to those parishioners who are unable to get to Mass. For more information, kindly call the Rectory.

Catholic School Policy

School-aged children of OLC may attend either **Notre Dame de Lourdes Catholic School** in Swarthmore or **Holy Family Regional Catholic School** in Aston . Our Parish does subsidize Catholic education for parishioners of OLC who are active and contributing members of the Parish, in accord with Parish Policy. PREP meets on Tuesday evenings from September to May from 6:30 to 7:45p.m. There is a minimal tuition requested to defray costs of the materials. Last Sunday's Blessing of the Sanctuary

The Bishop was very impressed with the renovations, as he indicated in his closing remarks at Mass. I thought the Mass and Blessings were a wonderful experience of joy and gratitude. So many of you made a point to see the Bishop or me afterwards. I am grateful for your many compliments about the work.

Summary of Changes to the Annulment Process in our Archdiocese

Enclosed in this week's bulletin is a summary page distributed by the Metropolitan Tribunal of our Archdiocese. We received this information in late December. This new summary outlines some of the changes reflected both by Pope Francis and our Archbishop about procedures and costs associated with the annulment process. Some highlights:

1. Process of seeking an annulment can now begin from your computer.

2. In accord with the wishes of Pope Francis, Archbishop Chaput has decreed that the annulment process now exists without cost or fees. The Archdiocese of Philadelphia will absorb the \$800.00 cost. Petitioners are asked to contribute something out of charity according to their means.

3. Brief Process or "Bishop's Process" initiated: In cases where a former spouse participates and is in favor of the annulment (and reasons or grounds to grant), a briefer process may be heard—which could be a time saver.

Please share the enclosed information with your family and friends. In this Year of Mercy, the Holy Father is looking for every way to help people and to make this canonical process more user-friendly. Of course, if I can be of any assistance, please let me know.

Second Sunday In Ordinary Time Reflections by Rev. Leonard Peterson

There are words that are worth a thousand pictures. Consider the resonance that the words "Mom" and "Dad" have. Consider other words in your ever-changing vocabulary. We have come to loathe those misguided people called "terrorists." Today at Mass St. John's gospel gives us a special word for a special place: "Cana." Just hearing it brings to my mind an imaginary "album" of memorable pictures.

I see a happy wedding reception and can almost hear danceable music playing. Tables overflowing with colorful flowers and tasty food. The happy family, some heads thrown back in hearty laughter. Then the special look on the faces of the bride and groom. Then a sudden anxiety on their faces as they learn that the wine has run out. Mary's concern as she is seen talking to her Son. His questioning expression. Then the chief steward's doubt. The heavy jugs of water being dragged out. The commanding gesture of Jesus. The shock on the steward's face. The puzzlement and relief of the newlyweds. The wonderment in the eyes of Jesus' new disciples as they are caught staring at Him. This is my "Cana album." Does it resemble yours?

We can learn many things from this touching story as we admire John for recording it. Above all, there is Our Lord's presence at a wedding party that automatically adjusts our thinking about God if we ever picture Him like a stern Walt Whitman. There follows from Jesus' presence the sanctification of marriage as a holy vocation and a sacrament. This last most threatened in our present day culture.

Then we come to note Our Blessed Mother's faith in her Son, and the effect her simple statement of fact has upon Him. The whole notion of intercessory prayer comes into its own as a biblically based fact. Her concern is hardly limited now to one young couple. She is Mother of the Church and therefore ours too.

We also learn something about real power. It is not always manifest with noise and violence like that of a cartoon movie. It works with subtlety and calm in answer to prayer and faith.

We treasure the truth that almighty God can actually be concerned for the so-called "little ones" in the world, like a pair of unnamed newlyweds living in a remote village. He loves even you and me, little as we are.

Yes, there is a lot that Cana teaches us. St. Paul tells us in his quoted Letter that using our varied gifts is one way to respond to the Lord's love that He showed at that little town event. We can do no less in life than to be "wedded" to His ideas for our own lives and daily decisions.

Speaking of the resonant power of words, we have today's Psalm telling us that we will one day realize our hopes and gain heaven if here and now we render to God something called "praise." That's the good word for today.
