Baptism:

The Sacrament of Baptism is usually celebrated on the First and Third Sundays of each month at Noon. Please call the Rectory and speak to the parish priest to register. First-time parents and godparents are expected to attend a pre-baptismal formation session, which is offered on the second Sunday of the month in the Church after the 10:30 a.m. Mass as needed,. To register for session, please call parish secretary before first Friday of each month.

Marriage

Couples planning to be married should contact the Rectory at least 6 months in advance of the intended wedding date. Attendance at a Marriage Preparation program is required in accord with Archdiocesan Policy.

Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion:

The parish priests are happy to assist anyone who wishes to receive the anointing of the sick, or to receive Holy Communion. Special Ministers of Holy Communion also assist in taking Holy Communion to those parishioners who are unable to get to Mass. For more information, kindly call the Rectory.

Catholic School Policy

School-aged children of OLC may attend either **Notre Dame de Lourdes Catholic School** in Swarthmore or **Holy Family Regional Catholic School** in Aston . Our Parish does subsidize Catholic education for parishioners of OLC who are active and contributing members of the Parish, in accord with Parish Policy. Children who attend public school are requested to register in our **PREP** Program beginning in first grade to seventh grade. PREP meets on Tuesday evenings from September to May from 6:30 to 7:45p.m. There is a minimal tuition requested to defray costs of the materials. No one is denied access to PREP because of an inability to pay.

Third Sunday In Ordinary Time

Reflections by Rev. Leonard Peterson

Certain movie scenes stay with us long after the screen grows dark. They become classics, at least to us if not Ted Turner. We can recite the actors' lines from memory. We can describe the scenery in detail. We know our movies.

Even if we can't do all that for gospel scene like today's from St. Luke, predating movies by whole centuries, the good doctor practically makes it easy for us to picture it in the cinema of our minds. Here is Jesus, the young but fully mature Nazarene, taking the teaching chair in the hometown synagogue. All is silent as He slowly unrolls one of the treasured scrolls. He reads from it the description of the power and mission of the much anticipated Messiah. Then, rolling up the scroll, He creates a pregnant pause followed by a stunning announcement that rocks the room. Already this is good dramatic action fit for the cinema. It will be the first of many homilies on the same subject: "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." In other words, "People of Nazareth what I just read is all about Me. I am that long-awaited Messiah."

We'll have to wait until next week to get the people's further reaction, but let me give you this "spoiler alert": it won't be good. And somewhat like Ezra before Him, Our Lord is declaring that He is the lawgiver. In today's Epistle, Paul will describe Jesus as the grand unifier of all the parts of the Church yet to become.

Now to draw a personal inference from this scene, we have to put aside any trace of false humility when we discover that we here and now are important parts of that Church. The People of God, an apt description of the Church taken up by the Second Vatican Council, needs all of us to be in "good working order" so that we can fulfill our mission. At the end of Mass, the priest or deacon will tell us to "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord." That's our mission!

Too often we act as if the Church's mission is meant for clergy to carry out. Or we assign it mentally to just about everybody else seated in the congregation of a Sunday morning because we believe they are better qualified, more informed, and especially more holy than us. All of that may be true, but there is no reason to think that we, because of our presumed lower rank, have no part. That, in brief, is not just double talk, but "devil talk." The evil One means to draw you away from God and lessen your self-esteem. Jesus believes in you. Isn't that enough, on this mid-winter Sunday, to convince you that being active in His cause is not just something made for movies.

Here is the perceptive and practical mystic saint, Teresa of Avila, with her take on the matter: "Christ has no body now on earth but yours; no hands but yours; no feet but yours. Yours are the eye through which His compassion looks out on the world. Yours are the feet with which He can go about doing good; yours are the hands with which He is to bless us now."
