Marriage:

Couples planning to be married should contact the Rectory at least 6 months in advance of the intended wedding date. Attendance at a Marriage Preparation program is required in accord with Archdiocesan Policy.

Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion:

The parish priests are happy to assist anyone who wishes to receive the anointing of the sick, or to receive Holy Communion. Special Ministers of Holy Communion also assist in taking Holy Communion to those parishioners who are unable to get to Mass. For more information, kindly call the Rectory.

Catholic School Policy

School-aged children of OLC may attend either **Notre Dame de Lourdes Catholic School** in Swarthmore or **Holy Family Regional Catholic School** in Aston . Our Parish does subsidize Catholic education for parishioners of OLC who are active and contributing members of the Parish, in accord with Parish Policy. SHAME ON DISNEY-ABC

ABC, which is owned by Disney, will launch a new show on March 6, "The Real O'Neals." It is billed as a comedy about an Irish-American family, loosely based on the life of one of its producers, Dan Savage. For those not acquainted with him, his maniacal hatred of Catholicism is so strong that it would be as though David Duke were hired to produce a show about African Americans. That comparison is an understatement: Duke may be a bigot, but he is not known for his foul comments. By contrast, Savage is so vulgar that the original full-page ad I wrote was turned down by this (New York Times) newspaper. Why? Because the obscenities were deemed too incendiary for its readers, even with the use of asterisks in place of letters. Savage has accused a politician of having sex-he used an obscenity-with the consecrated Host, the body and blood of Jesus. His filthy remarks about Jesus and Our Blessed Mother are so over the top that they would make Larry Flynt blush. Pope Benedict XVI, Pope John Paul II, and Cardinal Francis George are portrayed as perverts. And priests-he indicts all priestsare depicted as predators. This is a man who intentionally tried to infect a Christian activist, Gary Bauer, with his sick bodily fluids. He did so by licking the doorknobs of his office, including the bathroom door. When it comes to getting down and dirty, Savage has no equal in public life. ABC has won awards from the gay community for its show, "Modern Family." It has won awards from African Americans for "Black-ish." So concerned was the network that it might offend Asians with its new show, "Fresh Off the Boat," that it invited leaders to meet with producers. But when it comes to Catholics, ABC delivers Dan Savage. Reflections by Fr. Leonard Peterson Fourth Sunday Of Lent

March 6, 2016

Back in 1949, the writer Fulton Oursler gave the world his "take" on the Gospels and titled his book "The Greatest Story Ever Told." An apt description for sure about a story that never grows old.

But I daresay that this parable that we hear at today's Mass taken from Luke's gospel could well be named: "The Second Greatest Story Ever Told." Why? Because if there ever were an answer to the whole problem of human weakness, this wellknown parable is it. It is a story bound to console those of us who fail the Lord from time to time. It also is a transparent picture of two opposing reactions to God's mercy, as found in the character of the two sons' father.

Our own holy father, Pope Francis, has designated the current year as a Jubilee Year of Mercy. He inaugurated it last December 8 with the solemn opening of the "Holy Door" at St. Peter's basilica in Rome, and shortly after there were openings of the Holy Doors of cathedrals around the world. The opened doors symbolize the openness of God's mercy, allowing us to "enter" into His forgiveness of our sins.

The parable of the loving father, augmented by Paul's letter about reconciliation, and even the story from the Book of Joshua about the Israelites celebrating the Passover in their new homeland all highlight God's tender mercy.

So in this Year of Mercy, the parable especially makes for perfect preparation for confession. If you are one of those people who has a residual fear of confession, perhaps one left over from childhood, or even of a bad adult experience of the sacrament, this is the story to recall to try again. Don't be afraid!

The Church, acting as the good Mother she is, invites you and me to this embrace of God's mercy. There really is no good reason to carry around the burden of past sins. The confessional door is probably the one "holy door" most of us will pass through this year.

But on the way out of that same door suddenly our life stories become "great", in the sense that they align with God's will. That alignment brings a peace and contentment money cannot buy. No matter how far we have traveled to "distant lands" and squandered graces like the young son. Or grown jealous or cynical like the older son. God's "heart" is bigger than we can imagine. Meanwhile if you're still a little timid about making a good confession because you fear returning to your old familiar ways, it is a good thing to remember that "the will of God will never take you to where His grace will not protect you."

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This year we celebrate the important milestone of 50 years of solidarity with the Church in Latin America and the Caribbean. Like many other places throughout the world, Latin American Catholics face many challenges as they strive to live and share their faith. For example, in Peru, the 14 villages of Chazuta, in Moyobamba, are all located away from the city center, with the most remote places only accessible y oat. The faithful in these communities do not have access to catechetical formation, and members often feel separated from the life of the universal Church. Through a grant from the Collection for the Church in Latin America, the religious congregation of the Missionaries of Jesus was able to provide faith formation, spiritual retreats, and workshops to nearly 250 people. Through this program, members of the Chazuta villages felt the love and support of the universal Church.

In Columbia, the parish of Our Lady of Guadalupe in the Diocese of Garzon, is blessed with a large community; however, there are only a few priests to address its many needs. Through a grant from the Collection for the Church in Latin America, the parish was able to train pastoral and evangelization leaders. These leaders participated in formation on leadership and catechesis, as well as in spiritual retreats, so they could reach out to the larger community. The parish also created kits to aid in evangelization and teaching the faith to those in the community. Through this project, the parish was able to achieve its goal of creating an evangelization program that can reach the 3,700 families of the parish.

The Collection for the Church in Latin America, through projects like these family and marriage programs, as well as catechesis programs, empowers the faithful of Latin America to deepen their faith and share it with each other and the world.

Our Archdiocese will take up this Collection the weekend of March 12 and 132, 2016. Pease be generous and take this opportunity to share your faith with the families of Latin America and the Caribbean Your support will truly make a difference. Thank you and God bless you.
