Baptism:

First-time parents and godparents are expected to attend a pre-baptismal formation session, which is offered on the second Sunday of the month in the Church after the 10:30 a.m. Mass as needed,. Marriage:

Couples planning to be married should contact the Rectory at least 6 months in advance of the intended wedding date. Attendance at a Marriage Preparation program is required in accord with Archdiocesan Policy.

Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion:

The parish priests are happy to assist anyone who wishes to receive the anointing of the sick, or to receive Holy Communion. Special Ministers of Holy Communion also assist in taking Holy Communion to those parishioners who are unable to get to Mass. For more information, kindly call the Rectory.

Catholic School Policy

School-aged children of OLC may attend either **Notre Dame de Lourdes Catholic School** in Swarthmore or **Holy Family Regional Catholic School** in Aston . Our Parish does subsidize Catholic education for parishioners of OLC who are active and contributing members of the Parish, in accord with Parish Policy. Forty Hours Thank-Yous

Again, I echo the sentiments of so many of you who commented last week during the Forty Hours about how beautiful the Church and Devotions were. We were "doubly" blessed to have such fine preaching by Fathers Fedak and Whittingham. Our choir was outstanding. And the attendance was very good. As St. Paul reminds us, faith comes from hearing: which requires both a preacher and a hearer. Thank you to everyone who did their part to make everything so very beautiful. As one faithful parishioner said last Tuesday night, "I wish it wasn't over, and that we were coming back again tomorrow night for more." A truly beautiful sentiment of faith!

Confirmation is next Sunday, October 25 at 1:00 p.m.

We welcome His Excellency, Bishop Timothy Senior to our Parish next Sunday. He is coming to OLC to confirm 23 of our parishioners with the seven-fold gift of the Holy Spirit. Confirmation is always a joyous time for a Parish. We know that this is an important moment in the lives of our young people who are asking God to give them spiritual gifts, so that they may respond to His graces, and be enlivened by the Christian Faith. Next Sunday's Mass is open to all parish-ioners, and I would encourage you to attend Confirmation.

Synod on the Family, Rome, October 4-25

The Synod in Rome is taking up the Theme of the Family. Last year's Synod was to prepare for this current meeting of 279 bishops and priests, along with 90 experts, contributors and delegates from other Christian Churches, along with 50 lay auditors. Our own Archbishop Chaput is one of the four bishops elected to represent the United States at this Synod. Below is from Archbishop Chaput explaining what a Synod is and its work.

A synod – from the Greek word *synodos*, for meeting or assembly — is a global gathering of bishops called together by the Holy Father to give him counsel on a topic he chooses. Its role is purely advisory. The Pope can accept its counsel or choose a different path. But Francis has a keen sense of collegiality. He encourages a high degree of candor in discussing sensitive issues. And few subjects are more sensitive or more urgent than renewing the health of today's families, the focus of the current synod. If the first day's interventions were a sign, delegates at this synod will have no trouble being frank. Proceedings are closed to the public, but bishops are free to speak with the media, and many will. So as themes develop over the next three weeks, plenty of information will be available.

In his opening remarks on the first day of the synod, Francis urged his brother bishops to be guided by three principles in the days of discussion ahead: apostolic courage; evangelical humility and trustful prayer.

That's good advice for anyone seeking to live a genuinely Christian life. But it's vital for bishops in their work at the Synod on the Family....Please pray for me during this synod, that God gives me the ability to share that hope and joy. (*Note: Archbishop Chaput is a Relator, which means he is charged with making known his Committee's work to the Holy Father and the rest of the Synod. Next week, I will publish the summaries thus far, which he has asked us to share.)*

Reflections by Father Leonard N. Peterson Twenty Ninth Sunday In Ordinary Time

"Foot-in-Mouth" disease apparently has a long history, even though the ancient victims of it would have called it something else. For proof I offer the fact that at least three members of that original band of Jesus' – Peter, James and John – fell victim to it.

Today we hear how it happened. The brothers Zebedee approached Jesus, the very Person who declared Himself "meek and humble of heart", and they brashly ask Him for a prestigious post in His kingdom. Ironic if not slightly comical.

Notice Our Lord's reaction. No anger. No scolding. No disgusted demeanor. All He does is ask a dangerous question of the two seekers. He's done this before, remember, with a certain rich young man. This is it: "Can you drink the cup that I drink?" Here "cup" meant "Calvary."

This brings up an important point for our Christian living. Note that suffering runs like a red thread through the tapestry of Our Lord's life. From birth in a stinking stable to the agonizing death on a bloody cross it is there. In between were the nasty reactions to some of His sermons; the ridicule following His claims; the frustration of working with ignorant men. Then the betrayal of one and the denial by another. Indeed, He is Isaiah's "Suffering Servant" in the flesh. The author of Hebrews agrees when he writes of Christ being "tested in every way."

All you need do to compare and contrast the modern world's approach to suffering is to watch a few of the commercials crammed into the typical prime time TV schedule The constant in them is that "pain is insane" or "get rid of pain as fast as you can by taking "X."

As for that prestige so sought after by our two gospel guys, there's a widespread cultural pressure we all feel to "go for it" even if it only lasts for the famous "fifteen minutes."

No doubt, James and John learned from Christ by word and example that they were called to something much different: humble service of others. That will forever be a "CFC", or "Challenge for Christians. Some have even honed their skills at self promotion to an "art", and they are not limited to the laypeople in the Church. With our senses soaked in secularism almost every waking hour of the week, it's no wonder that our one hour with God on Sunday is not enough to counterbalance its influence. So we always come back to that need to have a prime place in our schedule for prayer. But may I offer this cautionary note? Many people view God as a kind of heavenly genie, ready when you rub the lamp of prayer to appear and say, "Yes, master; what do you want me to do?" But God is not like that. God is sovereign. God moves according to His own purposes, and He does not play games with us. He is not to be mollified and placated by a temporary return to Him when we get into difficulty. A good thing to recall just before inserting your foot into your mouth when you go to Him, even though He's always glad to hear from you.
